

To Reveal a Reckless Love:

Book Club Discussion Questions

1. Roger begins the story shattered by the news of his father's death, yet that loss strangely opens the door to freedom. *How does grief shape Roger's decisions, and in what ways does it become a turning point toward healing rather than retreat?*
2. Victoria travels across the country in search of her brother, driven by guilt, worry, and love. *What does her journey reveal about the power—and burden—of responsibility within a family?*
3. When Roger and Victoria first meet, their impressions of each other are colored by their past pains. *How do initial misunderstandings give way to deeper insight, and what does this say about learning to truly see one another?*
4. Both characters battle insecurity—Roger about his art, Victoria about her worth and choices. *Which character's emotional arc resonated with you more strongly, and why?*
5. The Yellowstone setting is almost a character in itself—wild, beautiful, unpredictable. *How does the landscape reflect and influence the inner journeys of Roger and Victoria?*
6. Victoria's longing for security contrasts with Roger's longing for freedom. *How do these opposing desires both clash and beautifully complement each other as the story unfolds?*
7. Art plays a significant role—from Grayson's sketches to Roger's passion for painting. *How does art serve as a bridge between characters, and what does it reveal about their souls?*
8. The theme of *forgiveness*—particularly Victoria's longing to reconcile with Grayson—runs deeply throughout the novel. *How does the story portray the difficulty, and necessity, of forgiveness in relationships?*
9. Throughout their journey, Roger repeatedly offers Victoria kindness without expecting anything in return. *How does this steady kindness change her, and what might it teach us about the quiet strength of gentleness?*
10. By the end of the story, both characters discover unexpected bravery—Roger in embracing his calling, and Victoria in opening her heart again. *What does the novel suggest about the risks required for love, faith, and belonging?*
